Liberty High School Teacher Elected to VATFACS Board of Directors

Bedford, VA – August 3, 2020 – The Virginia Association for Teachers of Family & Consumer Sciences (VATFACS) elected and installed its 2020-2021 Board of Directors during a virtual ceremony on June 29, 2020. Allison Revis, Family & Consumer Sciences teacher at Liberty High School in Bedford, Virginia, was installed as president of the organization. Ms. Revis will continue serving a two-year VATFACS Board of Directors term and hopes to use her experience to help further promote Family and Consumer Sciences education and support teachers in Virginia.

Revis is beginning her 15th year teaching Family & Consumer Sciences and has taught a wide variety of classes in middle and high school settings. Most recently at Liberty High School, Revis reactivated the FCCLA chapter and improved community involvement. Revis' students competed in the FCCLA state conference in various events, students gained additional experiences including the eligibility to compete at the National level. Revis received a B.S. in Family and Consumer Sciences in 2006 from Liberty University and a M.S. in Career and Technical Education from Virginia Tech in 2009.
